Content of the course

Topic of the course

- Biweekly 4 teaching hour classes, each focusing on a relevant film with the topic of a mental disorder
- Individual film watching between classes

Learning activities, learning methods

- Individual film watching
- Joint discussion of films in small groups
- Essay writing on the topic of films and mental disorders

Evaluation of outcomes
