PSYB19-137 Introduction to Adult and Child Clinical Psychology

Aim of the course

The global aim of the course is to provide students with basic but broad knowledge, skills and a perspective from adult and child clinical psychology.

Learning outcome, competences:

You will acquire knowledge about several topics from clinical psychology such as:

- Theories and models (based on solid studies) of psychopathology (etiology, manifestation, and its dynamics).
- Diagnostic systems
- The diverse (treatment) approaches from clinical psychology.

Attitude:

• Students will acquire a perspective from clinical-psychology, taking into account the complex interplay between biological, psychological, and social factors.

Skills:

- Students will discover how methods and principles from clinical psychology can be applied to diagnose and treat psychopathology.
- The foundation will be provided that prepares students for advanced training in clinical psychology.

Learning activities, learning methods

Primary knowledge acquisition will be via lectures and by reading the mandatory material.

Evaluation of outcomes

- Grade bonus (+1) for noteworthy additional work in the context of clinical psychology: i.e. participation in two experiments in clinical psychology, providing a presentation during class on a related topic, or writing a short review.
